# Minutes of the International Council 2020 of FIACAT June 2020

#### I. Quorum

21 affiliated ACATs and up to date with their 2020 membership fees or having undertaken a written commitment to pay their membership fee before the end of the year 2020 have appointed a Delegate before the beginning of the International Council out of the 25 affiliated ACATs of the FIACAT. A quorum is therefore considered to be reached in accordance with Article 3.e. of the FIACAT Rules of Procedure.

#### II. Election of scrutineers:

Ms. Maria Raharinarivonirina (Madagascar) (16 in favour, 5 abstentions) and Ms. Cécile Auriol (Germany) (17 in favour, 1 against and 3 abstentions) were elected as scrutineers.

#### III. Agenda of the International Council

The agenda was adopted without amendment by 17 votes in favour and 4 abstentions.

#### IV. Statutory resolutions

#### 1. Minutes of the International Council 2019

The International Council shall adopt without any reservation the minutes of the FIACAT International Council of June 2019 (15 votes in favour, 1 vote against, 3 abstentions and 2 null)

#### 2. 2019 Annual Report

After reading the 2019 Annual Report on the implementation of the Strategic Plan voted by the International Council in July 2016, the International Council shall approve the Activity Report as presented. (15 votes in favour, 1 vote against, 3 abstentions and 2 null)

#### 3. Financial report 2019

After reading the financial report for the financial year 2019, recording a positive result of 26,783€, the International Council approves the annual accounts 2019 (15 votes in favour, 4 abstentions and 2 null)

#### 4. Allocation of 2019 benefit

The International Council decides to follow the recommendation of the International Bureau and allocates the result 2019 (26,783 €) and the carry-over from 2018 (6,508 €) to be placed in Associative Funds without right of return (own funds)

#### 8. Strategic Plan 2020-2024

The International Council approve the strategic plan 2020-2024 presented by the International Bureau as it was presented (16 votes in favour, 3 abstentions and 2 null)

#### 9. Provisional budget 2020

The International Council approves the provisional budget for 2020, forecasting income of 1,010,299 € for expenses of 989,862 € and a positive result of 20,437 € (15 votes in favour, 4 abstentions and 2 null)

#### 10. Number of members of the International Bureau

The outgoing International Bureau of FIACAT has suggested to the International Council that the International Bureau of FIACAT may be composed of 8 members, including the President and the Treasurer. The Council approves this proposal. (14 votes in favour, 5 abstentions and 2 null)

#### V. Election of the new FIACAT International Bureau for 4 years

NODJITOLOUM Salomon, presented by ACAT Chad, is elected member of the International Bureau for 4 years (19 votes in favour)

CHALAUX FERRER Emili, presented by ACAT Spain, obtained 7 votes.

# " 2020, a world turned upside down by covid-19! "



On 11 March 2020, the coronavirus epidemic (Covid-19) was declared a pandemic by the WHO. The massive and brutal shock produced by the disease, and the measures put in place to curb it, have upset all parts of society. Authoritarian regimes eroded the basic freedoms of citizens and put democracy on holiday for "health reasons". The severe recession in the global economy has led to social crises in fragile countries. Social distancing has reinforced isolation, as places of sociability are no longer frequented. Indeed, 2020 has been very difficult for the associative world. For FIACAT and its network, there has not been any physical contact, advocacy missions or programme monitoring. However, FIACAT has not stopped functioning, and the International Secretariat has shown creativity and innovation in order to move forward.

As such, FIACAT's International Council was held electronically from 8 to 29 June 2020. A strategic plan for 2020-2024 was designed and adopted, incorporating three major axes: to fight torture and ill-treatment and to contribute to the abolition of the death penalty; to build capacity within and strengthen cooperation between ACATs; and to ensure the sustainability of FIACAT's activities. The International Board, elected for four years, now comprises eight members. Two new members have joined, and one has left, Massimo Corti, the longest serving member of the outgoing Board. I am grateful for his engagement and may he receive the solemn thanks of all the members of the network for his commitment and dedication.

Despite the health crisis, FIACAT continued to accompany ACATs before international and regional bodies. With regard to the death penalty, FIACAT was part of an important online event on 9 October 2020 ahead of the adoption of the resolution calling for a universal moratorium on the use of the death penalty by the United Nations General Assembly in 2020. It supported fifteen ACATs on the 18th World Day Against the Death Penalty. On 20 May 2020, Chad became the 22nd abolitionist country in Africa. FIACAT also continued to fight torture and cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment through its programme on abusive pre-trial detention (APD). Thanks to the ACATs, through the programme 1,428 detainees obtained a court decision following the processing of their case. On the strength of their results, the APD programmes in the Congo, Côte d'Ivoire and Madagascar were renewed. To prevent the spread of the virus in prisons, FIACAT has been active in providing training, undertaking partnerships and in supporting the work of the ACATs. In 2020, FIACAT also followed the issue of torture-free trade and strengthened its advocacy for Germain Rukuki, who, it is hoped, will finally regain his FREEDOM.

The year 2020 was challenging, but FIACAT and its network remained committed to those forgotten by justice, particularly through the use of digital technology coordinated by the Secretariat, whose work should be commended. We must nevertheless remain vigilant about strengthening and reinforcing the place given to civil society and human rights in this digital world. Let's get to work so that FIACAT can live on!

## Abolition of the death penalty

Chad

Chad abolished the death penalty on 20 May 2020 and became the 22<sup>nd</sup> country to abolish capital punishment in Africa.

Congo

The Senate and the National Assembly adopted the bill that authorised the ratification of the Second Optional Protocol to the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights (on 18 June and 12 August 2020), which aims to abolish the death penalty. The Act must now be promulgated by the President.

Efforts to abolish the death penalty and prohibit torture coincide with many of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), which FIACAT promotes through its activities, in particular:



# Ensure healthy lives for all

In overcrowded prisons, detention conditions do not comply with international standards and is conducive to the spread of contagious diseases. Efforts to limit pretrial detention reduce overcrowding and thus improve prisoners' health and hygiene. The death row syndrome has effects on the mental and physical health of those condemned to death which amount to torture or cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment. Abolition of capital punishment counters this phenomenon.



# Ensure quality education for all

FIACAT is aware of the importance of education and human rights training in preventing violations and therefore includes such training and awareness-raising in of all its activities.



# End all forms of discrimination against women

In all the countries where FIACAT is active, special attention is paid to fair gender representation among persons attending and speaking at workshops, in the recruitment of coordinators and consultants and in the composition of teams of volunteers carrying out its activities.



## Reduce inequality

Social and economic inequalities impair access to justice for prisoners and especially those sentenced to death. FIACAT verifies that the regulations pertaining to pre-trial detention are strictly applied to everyone without discrimination. Abolition of the death penalty also counters the effect of such inequalities with regard to access to rights.



### Build effective state institutions and provide access to justice for all

FIACAT's aim is to improve the operation of the judicial system by better cooperation between the authorities, the judiciary, prison services and civil society in order to prevent torture and abolish the death penalty.




### Revitalise the global partnership

Cooperation between the judiciary, prison services and civil society is central to the programme to combat abusive pre-trial detention in order to prevent torture in custody and allow all parties to work more effectively. Traditional chiefs and religious leaders, the media, parliamentarians, representatives of government and civil society organisations play a key role in abolishing capital punishment and are actively engaged in FIACAT's activities.

# ABUSIVE PRE-TRIAL DETENTION PROGRAMME RENEWED IN THE CONGO, CÔTE D'IVOIRE AND MADAGASCAR

2020 was a crucial year for FIACAT's pre-trial detention programme, with the end of phase 1 of the projects in Côte d'Ivoire, the Congo and Madagascar. FIACAT was aware of the need to take stock of its action and sought an external evaluation of the programme. The assessment was carried out

to ensure the programme meets the needs of the ACATs that it supports, and to adapt its approach and incorporate lessons learned towards improving prison conditions and combatting cruel, inhuman and degrading treatment through respect for judicial safeguards and reducing prison overcrowding. While the evaluation highlighted the pertinence, effectiveness and efficiency of the programme, it also allowed the project to evolve in the three countries. FIACAT thus decided to expand meetings between civil society and the judicial and prison services to strengthen synergies between stakeholders. In this new phase, FIACAT also decided to provide extra training for the ACATs to strengthen their autonomy.

# THE ABUSIVE PRE-TRIAL DETENTION PROJECT IS COMING TO AN END

The year also saw the end of the pre-trial detention project in Chad. It achieved its objectives of:

- strengthening the capacities of 120 persons belonging to the judiciary, prison services and civil society with regards to respect for the judicial safeguards for the accused;
- 1 495 judicial decisions were taken thanks to the identification and monitoring of cases of abusive pre-trial detention
- sensitising public opinion to the issue of detainees' rights, through events carried out during International Human Rights Day and the International Day in Support of Victims of Torture.

These results were obtained through a cooperation between the national authorities, civil society and the EU Delegation in Chad.

# THE LONG-AWAITED CRIMINALISATION OF TORTURE IN NIGER

In recent years, Niger had received many recommendations from regional and international human rights mechanisms for the criminalisation of torture in its domestic law. On 11 May 2020, an Act was finally passed that defines and criminalises torture in accordance with the Convention against Torture and Other Cruel, Inhuman or Degrading Treatment or Punishment. FIACAT and ACAT

Niger will now focus upon ensuring that this new provision is indeed put into practice, e.g. by training public officials.



## A CORE CONCERN OF FIACAT: THE INVISIBLE IMPACT OF THE PANDEMIC ON PRISONS

Places of deprivation of liberty have not escaped the Covid-19 health crisis. On the contrary, they are particularly at risk because of poor hygiene, overcrowding and the difficulty of accessing healthcare. Consequently, and in order to prevent the spread of the virus, they have been subject to many restrictions, which often infringe detainees' rights. FIACAT has acted repeatedly to bring this issue to the attention of the public and the authorities in the countries in which it operates. For example, it

supported ACAT Congo and ACAT Madagascar in organising meetings on the subject of Covid-19 in prisons, which was attended by national authorities, members of judicial and prison services and civil society and provided healthcare equipment and medicines to certain prisons. FIACAT also worked with the Plateforme des droits humains (PDH) on publishing a report "COVID-19 and Human Rights - Impacts and consequences of the pandemic". Finally, as part of a joint training course with Synergies Coopération on "Prisons: Prévenir la torture et les mauvais traitements" (Prisons: preventing torture and ill-treatment), FIACAT worked to produce a free module dedicated to disseminating information on the situation in prisons within the context of the coronavirus and to raise awareness among the actors in the penal system.

### TORTURE-FREE TRADE: A REGIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL PRIORITY

In 2020, FIACAT paid particular attention to the issue of torture-free trade. It took part in several consultations in connection with the adoption of the *EU action plan on human rights and democracy 2020-2024*. This new plan includes a specific reference to trade in goods used for torture in order to "Strive to eradicate torture globally through prevention, prohibition, accountability and redress for

victims, including by promoting the Global Alliance for Torture-Free Trade". FIACAT also took part in the expert consultation held by the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights on "Torture-free trade: examining the feasibility, scope and parameters for possible common international standards". FIACAT also addressed this question at European level by submitting its observations on the revised draft of the Recommendation on measures against trade in goods used for torture or other cruel, inhuman or degrading treatment or punishment and the death penalty of the Steering Committee for Human Rights at the Council of Europe.

Since 2012, FIACAT has been working with the World Coalition Against the Death Penalty on a programme that aims to abolish the death penalty in 23 countries on Sub-Saharan Africa.

## COVID-19: APPEAL FOR A WORLD MORATORIUM ON THE DEATH PENALTY DURING THE PANDEMIC

In 2020, while the whole world was striving to save lives in the midst of the health crisis, death sentences and executions continued. In Nigeria, death sentences were pronounced by video conference. At the same time, certain positive steps were taken to grant

# ACCESS TO COUNSEL: A MATTER OF LIFE AND DEATH

On 10 October 2020, the World Day Against the Death Penalty was devoted to the right to legal representation for those at risk of a death sentence.

As with every year, FIACAT's network mobilised to mark this World Day. On the African continent, the ACATs adapted their activities to the health context and took part in many radio and television broadcasts. They remained focused on appealing to public opinion and spread the message to nearly 500

pardons and commutations to imprisonment, for example in Cameroon or the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), in order to avert a potential disaster in overcrowded prisons where there is a high risk of Covid-19 transmission.

FIACAT, the World Coalition Against the Death Penalty and its members therefore appealed to all States to observe a moratorium on death sentences and executions on the grounds that it is impossible to ensure due process and fair legal representation during the pandemic.

## PRODUCTION OF ADVOCACY TOOLS

As part of the programme on the abolition of the death penalty in sub-Saharan Africa, FIACAT and the ACATs produced various advocacy tools specific

to the following countries: Cameroon, the Congo, Côte d'Ivoire, Ghana, Liberia, Madagascar and Niger. These publications serve to mobilise public opinion and to encourage these States to undertake greater obligations and commitments for abolition. The publication of 15 different advocacy tools is planned by the end of 2021.

## ABOLITION OF THE DEATH PENALTY IN CHAD


On 20 May 2020, Chad became the 22<sup>nd</sup> country in Africa to abolish capital punishment. The death penalty applied only to terrorist crimes, with the last execution of Boko Haram jihadis by firing squad taking place in August 2015. Regrettably, 4 persons condemned to death in 2018 are still held in appalling conditions in a secret location, separate

from the other prisoners.

In the words of Salomon Nodjitoloum, Chairman of ACAT Chad:

"Abolition of the death penalty for terrorist crimes is the culmination of the campaign by ACAT Chad and all abolitionists everywhere. By taking this brave decision, despite the recurrence of terrorist activity, Chad has joined the worldwide trend of abolition. Nevertheless, we continue to pursue our aim of ensuring respect for human rights."

# ADOPTION OF THE RESOLUTION ON A MORATORIUM ON THE USE OF THE DEATH PENALTY



On 16 December 2020, the United Nations General Assembly adopted, by a large majority of 123 states, the 8th resolution on a moratorium on the use of the death penalty.

## ORGANISATION OF A PANEL DISCUSSION ON THE RESOLUTION

Organised by FIACAT and the European Union delegation to the United Nations in New York, a

virtual panel discussion was held on 9 October 2020 focusing on "Worldwide tendencies: moving towards the abolition of the death penalty". This gathering brought together over one hundred participants from State delegations, civil society and universities and aimed to report on the current situation with regards to the abolition in the world and to encourage countries to vote in favour of the resolution.

#### ADVOCACY CAMPAIGN

Alongside the other members of the World Coalition Against the Death Penalty, FIACAT has committed to a worldwide advocacy campaign in favour of the United Nations resolution calling for a moratorium. An advocacy campaign aimed at persuading the authorities to vote in favour of the resolution was launched with the ACATs in Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, CAR, Chad, the Congo, the DRC, Ghana, Liberia, Mali, Niger and Senegal. The Congo and Chad ultimately voted in favour. Unfortunately, countries such as Niger, Senegal and the DRC either abstained or were not present for the vote. FIACAT has also lobbied certain States to add a paragraph to the resolution that urges the African Union to adopt the draft additional Protocol to the African Charter on Human and Peoples' rights on the abolition of the death penalty in Africa as soon as possible.

# THE CENTRAL AFRICAN REPUBLIC UNDER SCRUTINY BY THE UNITED NATIONS

At the beginning of March 2020, ACAT CAR's President was able to travel to Geneva to take part in the review of the Central African Republic (CAR) by the United Nations Human Rights Committee and inform the Committee's experts of FIACAT's and

### THE CONFERENCE OF INTERNATIONAL NGOS LOOKS AT THE IMPACT OF THE PANDEMIC ON CIVIL SOCIETY

The Covid-19 pandemic has had a marked impact on the work of non-governmental organisations in terms of funding, activities and access to their beneficiaries. FIACAT wished to draw attention to this problem and provided, along with other INGOs, a video testimony which was subsequently circulated within and by the Conference of international non-governmental organisations of the Council of Europe. The video highlighted steps taken to adapt

ACAT CAR's concerns, in particular with regards to combating impunity, the implementation of the 6 February 2019 peace agreement, the national Commission for human rights and fundamental freedoms and the death penalty. This mission also provided an opportunity to meet with Yao Agbetse, UN independent expert on the CAR, and discuss various issues which may have come to his attention during his February 2020 in-country mission. This meeting was useful in initiating contact and cooperation between the ACAT CAR and the new independent expert.

to this unprecedented context along with points where vigilance is still required.

In its testimony, FIACAT communicated that although it, and the ACAT network, have been able to continue their activities, they - in particular those working in the field - have run into difficulties. FIACAT considered it vital that international and regional organisations continue to ensure that civil society is engaged in their activities, via digital technology, whilst taking into account the lack of access to these technologies that many organisations on the ground face, and emphasised the need to ensure that human rights defenders remain safe in all circumstances. The public authorities must also collaborate with civil society organisations by, for example, making emergency funds available to assist those working to support the most vulnerable.

# ANNULMENT OF THE COURT OF APPEAL'S JUDGEMENT AGAINST GERMAIN RUKUKI

On 30 June 2020, the Supreme Court of Burundi annulled the judgement of the Court of Appeal which had condemned Germain Rukuki, the former accountant of ACAT Burundi, to 32 years in prison. Germain Rukuki, who is, however, still in prison, will be retried by a reconfigured Court of Appeal.

FIACAT has urged that the legal procedures scrupulously respect fair trial standards and the rights of the accused as required by both the country's Constitution and legally binding international human rights instruments that Burundi has ratified. The Supreme Court itself reminded the Court of Appeal of this obligation, maintaining that these rights "are an integral part of the Burundian Constitution under the terms of Article 19".

## FIACAT HOLDS A REMOTE INTERNATIONAL COUNCIL

FIACAT held its International Council electronically from 8 to 29 June 2020. During this session, the delegates of 21 ACATs elected a new International Bureau and adopted FIACAT's 2020 - 2024 strategic plan.

Elected for a four-year term, the International Bureau comprises 8 ACAT representatives of Orthodox, Protestant and Catholic faiths. Paul Angaman (Côte d'Ivoire) was re-elected President for a second term.

Despite Burundi's 2020 presidential election and the inauguration of its new president, Évariste Ndayishimiye, the human rights situation and the protection of human rights defenders remains a matter of concern in the country. On 23 June 2020, 12 exiled defenders, including ACAT Burundi's President, were condemned in absentia to prison sentences.



FIACAT's priorities for 2020-2024 will centre on three main topics: fighting torture and illtreatment and working towards the abolition of the death penalty; building the capacity within and strengthening cooperation amongst ACATs; and ensuring the sustainability of FIACAT's activities. In fact, banning torture and abolishing the death penalty are the main aims which underpin the activities of FIACAT and the ACATs, which have a unique expertise in this field. Despite the illegality of torture under international law, it is still frequently practised even now. FIACAT therefore hopes to continue to assist ACAT members and provide them with the necessary tools to protect their members who may be in danger because of their activities as human rights defenders.



#### A word from the Treasurer

In 2020, FIACAT had a positive result of €11,343, which means that it has been able to maintain a healthy balance despite the sanitary circumstances of 2020.

The activity of this year 2020 was globally a little lower (by about 12%) than that of 2019 because of the pandemic which limited the missions abroad and resulted in a partial unemployment of the employees (fortunately compensated by the State). FIACAT and the associated ACATs have used as much as possible, the subsidies from the funders, which have increased significantly compared to the previous year, which have increased significantly compared to the previous year. In particular, the activities of the major programmes against abusive pre-trial

detention and for the abolition of the death penalty in Africa unfortunately had to be reduced by 12% and 25% respectively compared to 2019, while the public subsidies increased very significantly. Thus, the remaining funds available at the end of 2020 are much higher than those of the previous year.

This difficult context has not stopped private donations, in particular from certain European ACATs, to whom we express our warmest gratitude, in addition to membership fees which have remained stable. The members of FIACAT and the individuals who are generous enough to support it regularly thus contribute to its necessary activity of supporting the ACAT network.

## **FIACAT**

International Federation of ACATs (Action by Christians for the abolition of torture), FIACAT, is an international non-governmental Christian organisation for the defence of human rights, created in 1987. It campaigns for the abolition of torture and the death penalty. The Federation covers some thirty national associations, ACATs, operating on four continents.

## FIACAT REPRESENTS ITS MEMBERS IN INTERNATIONAL AND REGIONAL BODIES

It enjoys United Nations (UN) consultative status, participatory status with the Council of Europe and observer status with the African Commission on Human and Peoples' Rights (ACHPR). It is also accredited with bodies of the International Organisation of La Francophonie (OIF).

In passing on to international bodies the concerns of its members on the ground, FIACAT aims to persuade governments to adopt and implement relevant recommendations. FIACAT promotes the application of international agreements for the defence of human rights, the prevention of torture in places of detention and fights enforced disappearance and impunity. It also campaigns actively against the death penalty by lobbying States to abolish this provision in their legislation. To make its voice heard even more widely, FIACAT is a founder member of several action groups, notably the World Coalition Against the Death Penalty (WCADP), the International Coalition Against Enforced Disappearances (ICAED), the Human Rights and Democracy Network (HRDN) and the Human Rights Platform (HRP).

## FIACAT REINFORCES THE CAPACITIES OF ITS THIRTY-STRONG ACAT NETWORK

FIACAT helps its member associations set up appropriate structures. It supports the process which makes the ACATs influential stakeholders in civil society who are able to increase public awareness and have an impact on the authorities in their respective countries.

It helps to strengthen the network by promoting exchanges, proposing regional or international training and joint intervention initiatives. It actively supports the ACATs' actions and enhances their work both internationally and regionally.

#### FIACAT, AN INDEPENDENT NETWORK OF CHRISTIANS UNITED FOR THE ABOLITION OF TORTURE AND THE DEATH PENALTY

One of FIACAT's missions is to raise awareness of torture and the problems arising from the death penalty among churches and Christian organisations and urge them to promote abolition.

#### Financial report 2020

This report gives a successive account of FIACAT's operations and financial situation in 2020.

These comments relate to the financing of the programmes, the profit and loss account for the year 2020 and the corresponding balance sheet until 31 December 2020.

#### 1. Funding of programmes

In 2020, FIACAT's main programmes and projects were as follows:

The second phase of the Death Penalty Programme (PDM) in Africa started on<sup>1</sup> July 2018, initially with the French Development Agency (AFD) as the main funding source for a 3-year period until 30 June 2021 (which has been extended until 31 December 2021), in partnership with the World Coalition Against the Death Penalty (WCADP).

At the same time, another funding has been committed for FIACAT, this time under the leadership of WCADP with 7 other partners, for 4 years from <sup>1</sup> January 2020, with the European Union as donor (European Instrument for Democracy and Human Rights - EIDHR).

This second phase received the following funding for FIACAT in 2020:

- from AFD: €298,571 in June, of which €145,258 was paid to the partner WCADP in July
- €37,153, this time received through the WCADP in February
- the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Luxembourg: payment of €30,000
- the Swiss Federal Department of Foreign Affairs (FDFA): €35,956 for advocacy at the African Commission on Human and Peoples' Rights (ACHPR).

At the end of 2020, dedicated funds of €135,898 remain on this programme to be carried forward to 2021.

The programme on abusive pre-trial detention (APD) continued through various projects and funding:

- ➤ In <u>Côte d'Ivoire</u>, the project funded by the <u>EU Delegation</u> with the EIDHR instrument for 10 prisons ended in February 2020: a grant balance of €58,705 was received in June 2020.
- A new projectAPRES CI ("Assister les Prévenus et favoriser la Réinsertion sociale des femmes et mineurs des prisons de Côte d'Ivoire") was launched in 2020 for 6 prisons with funding from the EU Delegation (again with the EIDHR instrument): funded by a grant of €228,699 in January 2020. At the end of the year, there are still dedicated funds of €101,749 to be carried over into 2021.
- AFD co-financing for three countries: Côté d'Ivoire again, the Republic of Congo and Madagascar. This programme ended in February 2020 and benefited from final grants from other donors, often retroactively for 2019 expenditure: €6,463 from the British Embassy in Madagascar in April 2020 and € 12,740 and €1,260 from Tavola Valdese in October 2020.
- ➤ A new phase II APD project opened in May 2020 with AFD funding for Congo (4 prisons) and Madagascar (2 prisons): a first tranche of AFD funding of €133,789 was

paid in November 2020. This new project was co-financed by several private donors in 2020:

- o ACAT Germany: €3,904 for Madagascar and Congo in May 2020.
- o the Paris Bar: €15,000 for Madagascar in July
- o the Lyon Bar Association: €2,000 for Madagascar in September.

At the end of 2020, €89,930 of dedicated funds remain to be carried forward into 2021.

Another project was completed in Chad on 15 December 2020 with the <u>European Development Fund</u> (EU) Justice Support Project (PRAJUST) as the main funding source: the second instalment of €87,171 was received in March 2020.

This project was co-financed in 2020 by CCFD-Terre solidaire for €10,000 and ACAT Germany for €4,201.

Dedicated funds from PRAJUST remained to be spent at the end of 2020 for €14,561 for the final evaluation and financial audit procedures.

The Prevention and Fight against Torture (PLT) programme, which enables ACATs to be involved in international advocacy and capacity building, continued with funding from :

- the ACAT France Foundation for advocacy at the UN: €10,000 was received in October 2020
- and Tavola Valdese: €2,000 received in April 2020.

There are still dedicated funds of €3,526 to be carried forward to 2021.

It can be seen that due to the pandemic, many activities could not be continued in 2020 or were carried out remotely, which led to less expenditure on travel and missions: this partly explains the size of the dedicated funds at the end of the year:  $\epsilon$ 345,665, compared with  $\epsilon$ 21,305 at the end of 2019.

#### 2. Income statement analysis

Operating income increased from &898,494 in 2019 to &1,045,061 in 2020. This is mainly due again to the very large increase in public grants in 2020: from &252,954 in 2018 to &618,831 in 2019 and &903,537 in 2020 (actually &916,507, minus &212,970 which had to be reversed at the end of the year). But this increase is largely explained by the start of the new APD projects (Congo - Madagascar, and Ivory Coast) in spring 2020 with grant instalments planned beyond this year alone. The same applies to the PDM project with AFD funding, which will be completed by the end of 2021.

At the same time, operating expenses amounted to  $\in 872,397$  in 2019 compared to  $\in 1,028,172$  in 2020, but this does not reflect a real increase in activity for two reasons:

- Subtract the expenses that are not linked to the direct activity of FIACAT: the payments made in 2020 to partners (the payment of administrative expenses to certain ACATs for the APD programme for €9,600 and €145,258 to the World Coalition Against the Death Penalty - WCADP for the PDM programme)

- Above all, it is necessary to subtract from the activity the provisions for dedicated funds: €333,518 in 2020 (compared to €13,091 in 2019, when we were nearing the end of the projects or the financing of tranches of grants).

In the end, this translates into a 21% decrease in real activity expenses, which can be explained by the constraints of the pandemic: removing these two factors, FIACAT's operating expenses are  $\[ \in \]$  539,796 in 2020 compared to  $\[ \in \]$  682,625 in 2019.

With regard to **dedicated funds**, it was necessary to include in the 2020 expenses the **new** dedicated funds **provisions** of  $\in 333,518$ , corresponding to funding received in 2020 for the part of the activities that remain to be implemented in 2021.

At the same time, the income for 2020 must include the recovery of dedicated funds from 2019 which were used as resources in 2020 amounting to  $\notin$ 9,158.

Overall, the accounts show a **profit of €11,343** in 2020 (compared to €26,783 in 2019), with **total income of €1,045,773 and total expenses of €1,034,430**, taking into account the differential of reversals and new provisions of dedicated funds and financial and exceptional income and expenses (which are small amounts). This positive result shows FIACAT's resilience to the pandemic in 2020.

#### A. Operating income:

There was a strong increase in public subsidies but a clear decrease in private subsidies: this was already the case the previous year.

As already mentioned, **public subsidies amount** to  $\notin 903,537$  in 2020 compared to  $\notin 618,831$  in 2019 and  $\notin 252,954$  in 2018. This is due to the development of a phase II of the programmes:

- APD programme: launch of the APRES project in Côte d'Ivoire with the EU (€228,699) and the APD project in Congo and Madagascar with AFD (€133,789)
- PDM programme: second tranche of the project with AFD (€298,591) and start of the project with the EU (€37,153).

On the other hand, **private grants are decreasing** sharply: they amounted to €147,272 in 2018, €99,906 in 2019 and €53,000 in 2020. For example, those of Tavola Valdese (payment in 2020 of previous endowments) and of the ACAT France Foundation (with the effect of the tax reform) are decreasing.

Among private donations and contributions, those of the ACAT ( $\[ \in \]$ 62,169) remain at the same level, as do donations from individuals ( $\[ \in \]$ 5,165), but the latter were higher before 2019. However, additional donations from ACAT have increased ( $\[ \in \]$ 9,729).

¹ Of the €21,305 of dedicated funds (not spent) at the end of 2019, €9,158 was used in 2020 (recovery of dedicated funds) and there is therefore €12,147 of previous resources not spent in 2020. To this must be added €333,518 of new resources from 2020 which have not yet been spent and which must therefore be placed in new provisions in 2020, which brings to €345,665 the dedicated funds remaining to be spent at the end of 2020.

#### **B.** Operating expenses:

Salary expenses fell sharply in 2020 due to the partial lay-off caused by the pandemic (fortunately partly compensated by the French and Belgian governments): they amounted to €208,387 (salaries and social security charges) compared to €240,513 in 2019, i.e. an exceptional decrease of 13% for the same number of employees.

**Purchases and external charges** have decreased significantly for the same reason, from €612,879 in 2019 to €481,473 in 2020, a decrease of 21.5%. The most significant decreases are international travel (from €52,587 in 2019 to €12,202 in 2020) and missions (from €104,069 in 2019 to €68,040 in 2020). However, some items have increased: maintenance and equipment, seminar and conference costs, and fees (with the end of phase 1 APD projects, resulting in external audits and evaluations).

Project expenditure in African ACATs has also fallen (except for workers' allowances), but to a rather lesser extent, reflecting a greater resilience with the maintenance of a large part of national activities by African ACATs less impacted by the pandemic.

#### 3. Comments on the balance sheet as at 31 December 2020

On the assets side, cash and cash equivalents at 31 December 2020 amounted to  $\[ \in \]$  316,421 compared to  $\[ \in \]$  101,403 at 31 December 2019. They are mainly in the bank (BRED) and marginally in the postal bank and in cash. To these liquid assets should be added the BRED shares of  $\[ \in \]$  68,303, which are a separate investment by nature (replacing the previous  $\[ \in \]$  50,000 of Optiplus investments subscribed previously). As this is a mutualist bank, this new investment does not depend on the financial markets.

Overall, this strong increase in cash is the counterpart of the high dedicated funds ( $\in$  345,665) on the liabilities side, which correspond to the increase in grants received in the year 2020, which should also cover a significant part of the activities in 2021.

As for the equity capital without right of withdrawal, it has increased significantly from €35,006 at 31 December 2019 to €68,298 at the end of 2020 due to the decision of the 2020 International Board to place the retained earnings and the profit of the 2019 financial year in it. These funds correspond almost exactly to the amount of shares subscribed to BRED.

#### **Conclusion**

In 2020, FIACAT showed a profit of €11,343 despite the drop in activity.

However, it still has its weaknesses. Indeed, private resources are steadily decreasing while public resources are increasing. In particular, the share of **non-dedicated private resources** represented 17.5% of FIACAT's operating income in 2018, 8.5% in 2019 and only 7.4% in 2020. And membership fees do not correspond to the level foreseen by the upward revision of their scale decided by the International Council in 2018.

Consequently, **FIACAT's own resources remain insufficient** for its other missions, such as the animation of the ACAT network and advocacy outside Africa and the United Nations.

#### **OPINION**

In compliance with the assignment entrusted to us by your International Council, we have audited the accompanying financial statements of the association INTERNATIONAL FEDERATION OF CHRISTIAN ACTION FOR THE ABOLITION OF TORTURE for the year ended 31 December 2020.

In our opinion, the financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position and assets and liabilities of the association as at 31 December 2020 and of the results of its operations for the year then ended in accordance with French accounting rules and principles.

#### **BASIS OF OPINION**

#### Audit framework

We conducted our audit in accordance with professional standards applicable in France. We believe that the information we have collected is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

Our responsibilities in accordance with these standards are set out in the section 'Statutory Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Annual Accounts' of this report.

#### Independence

We conducted our audit in accordance with the rules of independence provided by the French Commercial Code and the Code of Ethics of the Statutory Auditors for the period from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2020 to the date of issue of our report.

#### **OBSERVATION**

Without calling into question the opinion expressed above, we draw your attention to the point set out in the note "Dedicated funds monitoring table" in the appendix to the annual accounts concerning the accounting and determination of funds dedicated to future actions for the abolition of torture and the death penalty resulting from grants not used at the end of the financial year.

#### **JUSTIFICATION OF ASSESSMENTS**

The global crisis related to the COVID-19 pandemic creates special conditions for the preparation and audit of the accounts for this exercise. Indeed, this crisis and the exceptional measures taken as part of the state of health emergency have had multiple consequences for associations, particularly on their activities and funding, as well as increased uncertainty about their future prospects. Some of these measures, such as travel restrictions and distance working, have also had an impact on the internal organisation of associations and on the way in which audits are carried out.

To the Members of International Council,

It's up to management to prepare annual accounts presenting a fair picture in accordance with French accounting rules and principles. The annual accounts have been approved by the International Bureau. As part of this financial statement, we bring to your attention the facts described below.

Access to your bank account with BANQUE POSTALE has been blocked for several months. Despite the sending by your Executive Director of documents from the prefecture justifying the change of address of the head office and that of the SIRET number, the association no longer has access to the POSTAL BANK bank statement since the beginning of the year 2019 preventing the recording of transactions.

The accounting balance was closed on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2019, an amount in your favor of € 6 130.

It appears that this bank account is not significant in the presentation of the annual accounts in view of the low volume of financial flows that it generates. Consequently, we will not express any reservations in our report on the annual accounts concerning this situation.

However, we ask you to implement the necessary measures which will make it possible to regularize this situation as soon as possible.
